Subject :- Types of Interrogative Sentence

We will talk about the first type of interrogative sentence that is whquestion .

1-Wh-question: This types can be formed through the relation between whquestion and an object in a declarative sentence.

We have many types of wh-question and we will explain them in details :

7-Which: This article refers to choice only . for example :

-Maha bought the blue dress.

To change a declarative sentence into interrogative, we will apply the following steps:

- 1-The above sentence is declarative.
- 2-It consists of a subject (Maha), a main verb (bought), an object, a definite article (the), an adjective color (blue), a noun (dress).
- 3- We put a wh —question (which) at the beginning of sentence because an object refers to choose of adjective color (the blue dress).
- 4-We omit an adjective of color (blue).
- 5- We put a noun of inmate (dress)
- 6-The tense of sentence is the simple past tense, and it does not contain an auxiliary verb.

- 7-We must derivate an auxiliary verb according to tense of the sentence that is (did).
- 7-We put a subject(Maha).
- 8-We change a main verb from (bought) into (buy) because of existence (did).
- 9-We add a question mark (?) at the end of sentence.
- 10- An interrogative sentence is:

Which dress did Maha buy?

Another example:

The tall boy is my brother.

- 1-The above sentence is declarative.
- 2-It consists of a subject ,a definite article (the) , an adjective of body (tall) , a noun (boy) , an auxiliary verb (is) , an object (my) an adjective possession , (brother) a noun .
- 3- We put a wh-question (which) at the beginning of sentence because a subject refers to choice (the tall boy) because of existence (an adjective of body).
- 4-We omit an adjective of body (tall).
- 5- We put a noun (boy).

6-we put a auxiliary verb (is).

- 7-We change an adjective possession from (my) into (your) and add a noun (brother) .
- 8-We add a question mark (?) at the end of sentence.
- 9- An interrogative sentence is:

Which boy is your brother ?
